Graduate School of Library, Information and Media Studies

Information networks play an increasingly vital role in the circulation and use of knowledge and information, to which traditional books, materials, and academic literature have made a massive contribution. The importance of information in multimedia form continues to grow. While information networks have become similar to a huge library from which we can obtain knowledge and information, we must develop new library functions that allow us to home in precisely, from huge volumes of data, on the information we require. In response to this need, we conduct far-reaching and interdisciplinary research on information and media, the fundamental technology that underpins all academic fields.

The University of Tsukuba, a national research university, offers an academic and international environment for students. The Graduate School of Library, Information and Media Studies (GSLIMS) provide an interdisciplinary environment for the study of library, information and media sciences. GSLIMS is an internationally-recognized member of iSchools, a global consortium of research-oriented information schools, and is also a member of CISAP, a consortium of information schools in the Asia-Pacific area.

LIS English Program for master's degree

This program is designed for international students who intend to pursue careers as information professionals in a global context. A special focus of this program is to provide students with the opportunity to study Japanese advanced information technologies and advanced knowledge and skills for the management and delivery of knowledge and information resources.

This is a two-year program starting in October, which can be completed in English. Students can obtain a Master of Science degree in Library and Information Studies.

Admission

Applicants must meet at least one of the following criteria to apply.

- (A) Individuals who have graduated or who will graduate from a Japanese four-year university by September 2017.
- (B) Individuals who have graduated from a university outside Japan that implements 16 or more years of school curriculum up to university graduation, and earned a bachelor's degree.
- (C) Individuals who are expecting to graduate from a university described above, and earn a bachelor's degree by September 2017.
- (D) Individuals who are 22 years of age or older as of September 2017, and whose qualification is recognized as equivalent to a bachelor's degree as the result of the Eligibility Screening conducted by us.

Student applications will be assessed according to the following criteria.

- 1) Proficiency in English;
- 2) Basic knowledge; and
- 3) An interest in studying the topics offered by LIS.

Application schedule

- Deadline for the application: December 2016
- Interview by video conference or at the UT: January 2017
- Announcement of the selection results: February 2017
- Enrollment period: October 1, 2017
- Program start date: October 1, 2017



Degree Requirements

- (A) Students must complete a minimum of 30 credits.
 - Research Methods in Informatics (2 credits) and a minimum of 18 credits from lectures.
 - Practical Seminar A, B, C (Total 6 credits) and Synthetic Seminar on MSc Research (4 credits)
- (B) Students must give an interim presentation.
- (C) Students must submit a Master thesis written in English and pass the thesis defense.
